Dear Sir/Madam,

The Tobacco Association of Hong Kong ("TAHK") is aware that the HKSAR Government has recently launched a public consultation relating to reforms to our tax system and the introduction of Goods and Services Tax ("GST"). As we share the view that this is an important issue that will affect the community and business sectors as a whole, we are currently reviewing the consultation document with an aim to contribute to this vital discussion.

The consultation document sets out that certain indirect taxes would be adjusted following the introduction of a GST to reduce economic distortion and revitalize competitiveness. However, it is much to our surprise that tobacco tax is being left out from the list of proposed indirect tax adjustments which include such items as duty on liquor, petrol, diesel and aircraft fuel.

We would therefore like to seek clarification with regard to the proposed treatment of excise duty on tobacco products corresponding to the introduction of GST, which has not been addressed in the consultation document. Only with this information could we study the impact of GST on the tobacco industry and contribute to the public discussion with our views.
