I'm here to express my objection on imposing GST in HK.

In the consultation document, it is said that the GST is not to increase the income of the government, but to broaden the tax base. In addition to this, the income from the GST in the first five years will be used for returning the fund to the public.

I think this is very stupid. The government have to use a lot of money and labour force to impose the tax, but the reward is nothing, this is strictly a waste of time and money.

The government should have aware that the excecutive charge on GST is huge. In some European countries, for example, France and Britain, the VAT (ie.
